

Do you have Rheumatoid Arthritis?

A clinical research study called the RA Study is currently looking for individuals with rheumatoid arthritis (RA).

The purpose of the RA Study is to test the safety and effectiveness of an investigational study medication for individuals with RA.

To qualify for participation in the RA Study, you must:

- Be 18 years or older
- Have been diagnosed with RA for at least six months
- Have been over 16 years old when first diagnosed with RA

There are additional study requirements that you are required to meet to qualify for participation in this clinical research study. Eligible study participants will receive study-related medical care and investigational study medication at no cost. As with any medication, the investigational study medication in the RA Study may cause unwanted side effects. In previous clinical research studies, the most common side effects reported by people who took the investigational study medication were headache, upper respiratory infection and diarrhea.

There are other risks that are associated with taking the investigational study medication, some of which may not yet be known. The study doctor will explain the possible risks to you and answer any questions you may have about the RA Study should you choose to learn more.
